

## The Department of History solicits applications for the Harry Barnard Dissertation-Year Fellowship in American History

In 2010-2011 the Harry Barnard Dissertation-Year Fellowship in American History will provide one dissertation write-up fellowship in the amount of \$5,000\*, plus Advanced Residence tuition, required fees, and university basic student health insurance. The fellowship seeks to support dissertation research that promises to make a significant contribution to understanding American culture, politics, and the pursuit of human values and social justice in American life. United States history students entering the final year of dissertation writing are eligible. Barnard fellows can teach one course or hold other fellowships during the award year, but cannot hold a preceptorship or other year-long teaching position. Fellowships will be awarded for three consecutive quarters, without interruption, starting in the autumn quarter of 2010-11.

### Application materials:

The following materials should be submitted to the department:

1. SSD Dissertation Fellowship Application form, available in Foster 107 and online;
2. Applicant Statement (no more than 4 pages) describing the dissertation project, organization and methodology.
3. A copy of the approved dissertation proposal;
4. Status report and timetable for the completion of the dissertation;
5. Letter of recommendation from the dissertation director;
6. The Department will provide a transcript.

\*Stipend disbursed in three equal quarterly payments of \$1,666 unless graduation occurs earlier.
